Christmas Luncheon

The beautiful Christmas luncheon will be at the Saticoy Country Club on Friday December 8th. We encourage everyone to bring their loved ones or anyone else. There are always booths of items that make lovely Christmas gifts. We also have our lovely Tree raffle as well as "Sound on Sound," a female musical duo performing. And the menu for this year is:

Coffee or tea & warm bread basket with butter at every table. **First course** is a Holiday Salad. **Second Course** is your choice of the three following dishes: 1) Japanese Pumpkin Ravioli: six ravioli stuffed with blend of Japanese pumpkin, sweet potato and mascarpone with a touch of garlic, finished with a nutty brown butter sage sauce 2) Chicken Crepes: two crepes filled with tender chicken breast and savory mushrooms topped off with a white wine mushroom cream sauce, served alongside wild rice pilaf and vegetable medley 3) Honey Wholegrain Mustard Glazed Atlantic Salmon: five ounce scottish salmon fillet topped with our signature jack daniels wholegrain mustard glaze served alongside wild rice pilaf and vegetable. **Third Course** is a Single Scoop Hot fudge Ice Cream Sundae vanilla ice cream + hot fudge + Chantilly cream + nuts + cherry. 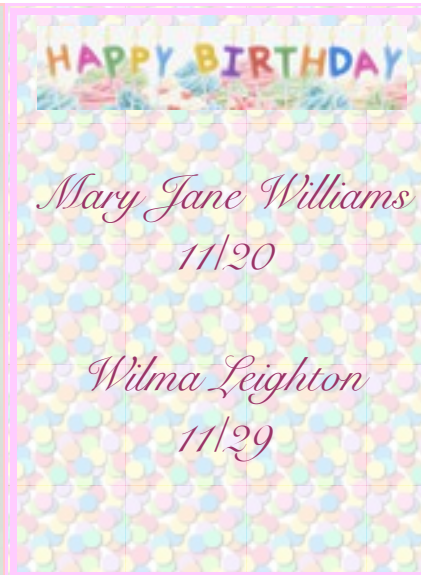
NOVEMBER CERAMICISE
