### June Martin's Cheesy Grape Dessert from the Potluck Auction:

#### Ingredients:

8oz cream cheese  
8oz sour cream  
8oz marble cheddar cheese, grated  
½ cup sugar (June used powdered)  
1 cup brown sugar  
1 cup chopped pecans  
2lb white seedless grapes  
2lb purple seedless grapes

#### Instructions:

Wash grapes. Let dry completely. Meanwhile beat cream cheese until smooth. Add sour cream and white sugar; beat until creamy. Gently stir in cheddar cheese and grapes. Scoop into 13 x 9 inch dish. Set aside. In a separate bowl stir together brown sugar and pecans. Sprinkle over grape mixture. Refrigerate overnight. Serve chilled.
